Tuesday Ladies Club (TLC)

This is a *Social League*. Each week has a different "game" that is played with the possibility to win prize money. Typically we have a breakfast the first Tuesday in May at the course clubhouse and league play starts the following Tuesday. Also there is one luncheon in June, July, and August where the *weekly prizes* are given out. A special golf format is played and the foursomes are set up by the volunteers handling the luncheon. All golfers will tee off at the same time from their assigned hole. The league banquet occurs on the last day of league play in the evening at a local restaurant chosen by the banquet committee. There is an additional fee for the luncheons and banquet.

League Rules

Tee times begin at 7 a.m. and run until 9:30 a.m. It is up to you to choose a tee time each week, but not on luncheon days. After checking in, sign up your group for the following week. If your group is not at the course, only one group member should call the course starting at 9 a.m. to schedule a tee time for the next week. If you are a single golfer, please join any tee time with an opening and get to know the other players.

NOTE: You may ONLY sign up your own group (a 2-4some) for the following week in ONLY one (1) tee time slot.

- Please notify Edgewood as well as your group's members as soon as possible if you will not be golfing.
- All members should be familiar with the rules of golf, course rules, and etiquette rules. Kindly help others in your group to be aware of the rules (if needed).

See additional Rule Reminders below.

- Please play *Ready Golf* so that you can keep up with the group ahead of you. **Always be** aware of when it is your turn to play and feel free to play out of turn if another player isn't yet ready. You can let the group behind you play through if necessary.
- This league plays "winter rules" or "preferred lies." If your ball lands on a damaged area in the FAIRWAY ONLY you may move your ball to improve your lie within one (1) club length of the original ball landing, but not closer to the hole. Otherwise, play your ball where it landed.
 - Only members with recognized TLC handicaps are eligible for the weekly prizes. *New* members <u>must</u> turn in five 9-hole scores (from play at Edgewood or any regulation golf course) to establish a handicap.
 - Weekly prizes are not awarded unless 12 or more players finish a round of 9 holes. If less than 12 members play on a scheduled league day, their scores still count toward

their handicaps.

- Members <u>must</u> have seven (7) recorded days of league play to be eligible for end-of-year prizes.
 - Golf will ONLY be *cancelled* when the course is closed. The President will send an email to the members as soon as notified by Edgewood. Otherwise, it is your choice to golf or not. If you do not golf, tee times for the next week's league play can be made by calling the pro shop starting at 9 a.m.

Rule Reminders

- **DO NOT** spend more than 3 minutes searching for your ball.
- A ball hitting a flag stick at any time is not a penalty.
- A ball drop MUST be taken from knee height.
- Hitting another player's ball is a 2-stroke penalty.
- You may take relief outside a bunker, but <u>not closer</u> to the hole for a 2-stroke penalty.
- Accidentally moving your ball while searching for it or while on the putting green <u>does</u> not incur a penalty. However, you <u>must</u> return the ball to its original position.

Course Information

<u>Pines Back #13-Bridge Hole:</u> When attempting to get on the green and your ball goes into the water, you may drop a ball on the other side of the bridge on the right side and take an additional stroke.

<u>Oaks Back #14:</u> For a tee shot into the water, you can go to drop zone on the other side of the pond (on the left front of the green just past the wooden stakes) for your next shot. This will be your 3rd shot.

<u>Oaks Back #15:</u> If you hit your ball into the water in front of the tee box, you may either tee up another ball or take a drop on the other side of the water. This will be your 3rd shot.

<u>Oaks Back #16:</u> If you hit your ball into the reeds in front of the tee box, you may either tee up another ball or take a drop on the other side of the reeds. This will be your 3rd shot.
